Assessment and Evaluation Strategies for Student Learning

Assessment takes place on a daily basis and is a key part of the learning/teaching process. Ongoing assessment of student learning informs students about what they have learned and what they have not yet learned.

Students will be provided with a variety of opportunities and ways to demonstrate their learning and understanding in relation to the curriculum (learning outcomes) for the subject/course. Student learning will be assessed using:

- Conversations with students
- Observations of learning
- Checklists -Communication
- Observed level of participation
- Products students create to show their learning throughout the process

Assessments are on-going throughout the year and are based on curriculum outcomes. This information is used to evaluate students and report on levels of achievement as indicated on the report card.

Report Cards:

Report cards are provided to students/parents three times a year communicating student learning and development of social skills and work habits.

- Show positive personal and social behaviors, good sportsmanship and fair play.
- Demonstrate an awareness of safe play.
