2023-24 TERRY FOX RUN/WALK



REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES

One of our top priorities is ensuring that all students arrive safely at school each day. To assist us with this, we use the Safe Arrival process, accessed through the *SchoolMessenger* app. The phone app allows parents and guardians to notify the school in advance about an upcoming absence or rapidly respond to excuse an absence after the fact. In both situations, you can send attendance alerts to the school for all of your students and provide a reason for each absence – all in one simple communication. Families are asked to please download and use the app to report absences. Other options include the SafeArrival website (go.schoolmessenger.ca) or the toll-free automated phone system (1-833-578-0533)
