



Public Health Reminders Before School Begins

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

It's an exciting time for your family, your child is starting school or pre-primary soon! Here are some reminders from Public Health to think about **BEFORE school begins:**



Routine Immunizations

Talk to your health care provider or local Public Health office to ensure your child's immunizations (needles) are up to date. These vaccines are publicly funded, meaning families do not have to pay to immunize their children, even if they do not have an MSI number (Nova Scotia Health Card). COVID-19 Immunizations

All Nova Scotians are encouraged to receive their full primary series of COVID-19 vaccine, and stay up to date with the recommended booster doses to ensure maximum protection. For more information, please visit www.nshealth.ca/coronavirusvaccine.



A routine eye exam between ages 2-5 years old by an eye doctor is covered by MSI every two years until your child's 10th birthday with a valid Nova Scotia Health Card. For more information, please visit www.nsoptometrists.ca.

Dental

Your child should be seen by a dentist by their first birthday. For children in Nova Scotia who are not covered by private dental insurance, here are some options that offer coverage for dental care:

Children's Oral Health Program (MSI) covers services until the end of the month of a child's 15th birthday. Call toll free at 1-833-739-4035 or visit the Children's Oral Health Program website at novascotia.ca/dhw/dental-programs/children-oral-health-program.asp.

Hearing/Speech

If you have any concerns about your child's hearing or speech, a parent/guardian may make a referral to the Nova Scotia Hearing & Speech Centre in your area for a free assessment. These services are available at no cost to preschool children who have a valid Nova Scotia Health Card.
